- The ability to supervise and guide specialists in family affairs in the future.
- **C. Targeted Qualifications and Skills**
The specialization in Family Law includes various elements related to society and influences public life in its various aspects, including political and economic ones.
- A deep study of this specialization allows the student to understand the nature of family relationships through a vast amount of information and knowledge, from the establishment of the marital relationship to its termination. The student will then be able to offer solutions inspired by Algerian Family Law and Islamic jurisprudence, in accordance with Article 222 of the Algerian Family Code. The stability and progress of society depend on the well-being of the family, which is considered by the legislator as the fundamental unit in the construction of society. This makes us think about the legal and legislative frameworks that are appropriate, by searching to support, amend, or enrich them to serve the interests of individuals, guarantee their rights, and support their freedoms, whether related to the

husband, wife, or children. All of this depends on training researchers specialized in family law, with a broad culture and expertise in family legislation.

- **D. Regional and National Employment Opportunities for Graduates**

Upon obtaining this degree, the student can be employed in the courts by joining the High Judicial School. With excellent training, the graduate will be able to take on the responsibility of issuing judicial rulings in family law cases.

Course Title: Family Law in International Law

Credits: 1

Coefficient: 1

Learning Objectives:

This course primarily aims to provide the student with a general understanding of human rights, with a specialized focus on the rights of women and children. The student will explore the content of these rights, study how they are protected, and examine the international mechanisms created to ensure they are not violated.

Prerequisite Knowledge:

The student should have acquired general, introductory ideas about human rights and their protection mechanisms during the undergraduate stage. This course will move from a general and broad study of these concepts to a more specialized and in-depth analysis.

Course Content:

1. **Introduction**
2. **Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women:**
 - Definition of discrimination against women.
 - Measures that must be taken to combat discrimination (in political, educational, labor fields, and equality before the law).

3. **Convention on the Rights of the Child:**
 - Procedures and measures that member states must adopt (right to identity, right to express views, right to information, children deprived of a family environment, rights of refugee children, rights of disabled children, right to health, right to education, rights of children deprived of liberty, rights of children during wartime, and rights of children accused of crimes).
4. **Mechanisms for Protecting Children's Rights:**
 - Establishment of a committee on children's rights (composition, tasks, etc.).

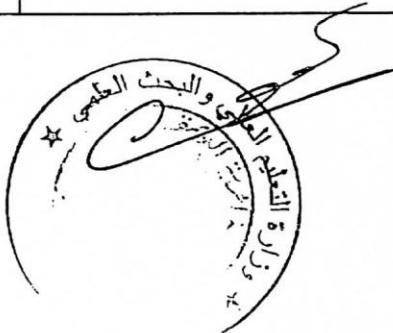
